

COLLABORATION SWEET SPOT FILTER

Using data from our Collaboration Impact Study, this tool is designed to help create a process for evaluating collaborative opportunities. The filter incorporates a checklist of benefits and ingredients for success that the study identified along with a scoring system to assist in making informed decisions.

The Collaboration Sweet Spot Filter can assist with identifying the goals, roles and expectations of the collaborative opportunity upfront; selling the collaborative opportunity to leadership and/or stakeholders; and establishing belief and trust in the collaboration from the start.

8. Will the collaboration help us improve our organizational culture?

1. Will the collaboration benefit all of the partners?	
2. Are there strong champions for the collaboration?

1. Is there accountability in place for collaborative partners' contributions?	
2. Are leadership teams well-informed for all participating partners?	
3.Is there full commitment by all participants?	
4. Are the resources available to see the collaboration through?

What's the score? A 60 or above makes this collaboration very likely to succeed and deserving of thoughtful consideration. Did the score come under 60? That doesn't necessarily mean the collaboration is not viable.
